B. crops at 20, 10 and 5, or more and poor, short, hard burned crops, suitable only for export purposes, not below 15, 5 and 3, or more.

If not sold at delivery time, let each land owner and tobacco raiser call at our office with a fair sample to complete the terms of picking on the profit-sharing plan.
