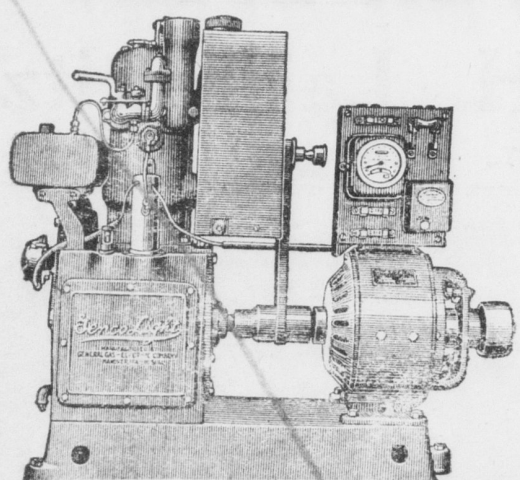

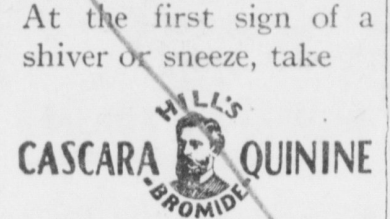
The Genco Light Plant
