

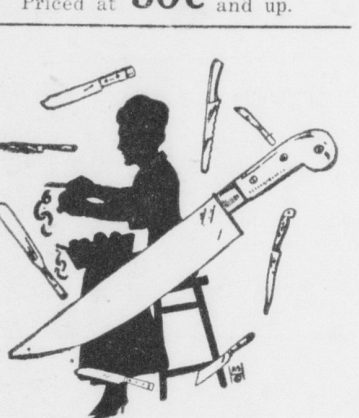

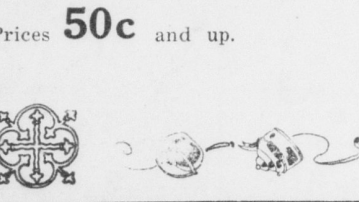


EVERYTHING YOU NEED FOR PLANTING TIME

A window box made of wood and placed outside your kitchen window with parsley, water cross, etc., will furnish you with a good supply of table greens which will be handy to get at for quick use.

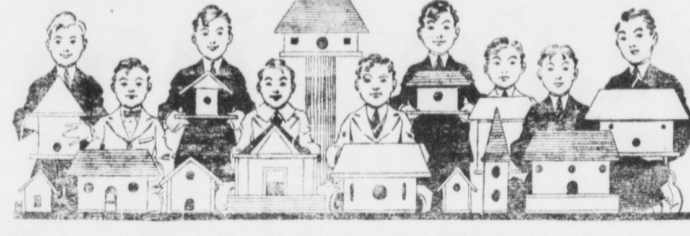
