

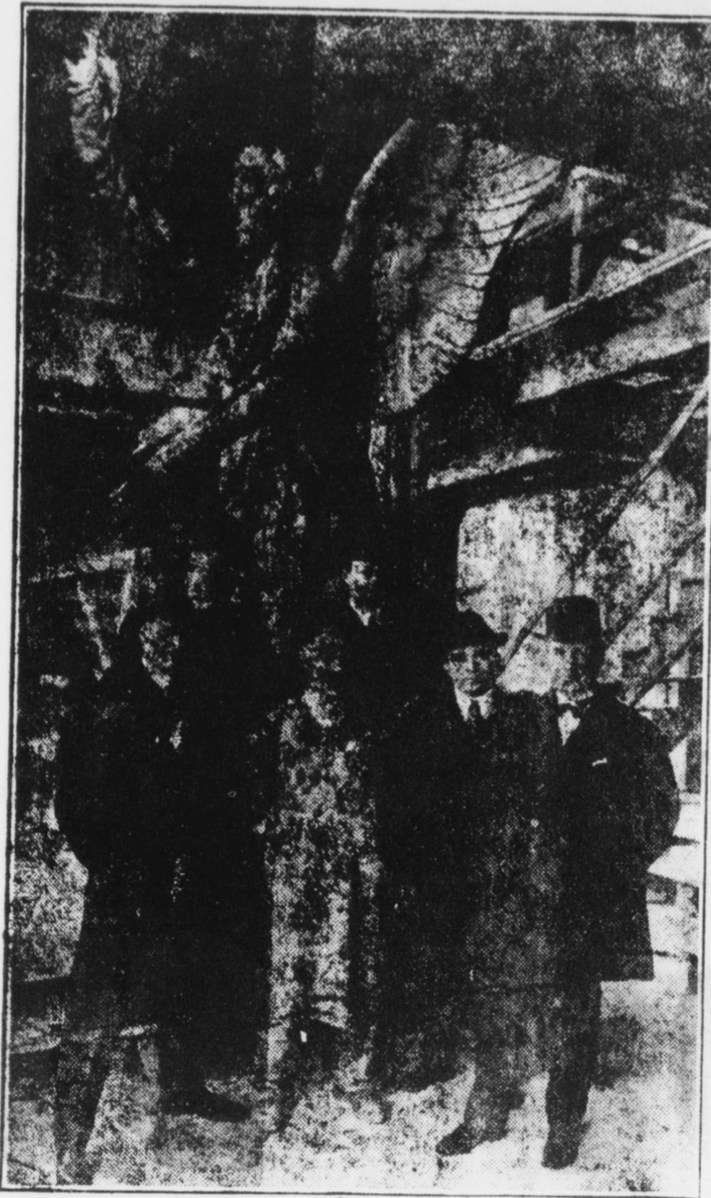

## SMALLER TOWNS GET BIG SHARE OF LOAN FEATURES

Dirigible Balloon Flights, War Trains, Trophies and  
Speakers Are Provided.

Rural communities throughout the entire Third Federal Reserve District are to have bigger and more spectacular methods of campaigning during the Victory Loan Drive than in any of the four preceding loans.

Features galore, many of them entirely novel, will be ready for the enjoyment of the great mass of people who live outside the big cities. Something will be doing almost constantly from the start of the campaign on April 21 until it closes May 10.

No detail has been overlooked in the effort to make this last campaign most intensive in the smaller towns and country districts. Plans already completed and others which are under way provide for carrying Liberty's message into every corner of the district.

One of the biggest features is the flight of a huge naval dirigible, equipped with all its engines of destruction as used in actual warfare. This balloon will travel from its base near Philadelphia to the far corners of the district, making at least two flights each week of the campaign.

During its daily flights it will be in the air twelve hours, half of which time will be spent in flying over the towns and communities far into the interior. It is capable of making a speed of 50 miles an hour, and easily can reach the most distant communities and return the same day, making several demonstrations en route. So watch the sky, and your vigilance, no doubt, will be rewarded.

The dirigible will be piloted by one of the most capable flyers in the Navy, Ensign C. W. Tyndall, of New York, who spent many months guarding the Atlantic Coast from the air, on the lookout for German submarines. He has mastered every trick of operating the big monitor of the air and will fly at low altitude, so that good opportunity may be had to observe the manipulation of the balloon. During his flights he will from time to time release smoke bombs, such as were thrown about troops when they were being conveyed across the Atlantic. He will also drop Victory Loan literature.

Another big feature will be the distribution of interesting motion picture films to hundreds of towns—some of them showing American soldiers in action in France. Deeds of doughty heroism, which put fear into the heart of the Boche, feats of the "Teufel Hunden" or "Devil Dogs," as the Germans called the American marines, and exploits of "those few Yankees" who dashed over the top with no thought of personal safety—these and other thrilling features will be shown on the screen.

## FARMERS' COLUMN

Items in These Columns Are Prepared in the Department of Agriculture at Washington, D. C., and Are Reliable and Trustworthy

### POULTRY

All cripples should be killed immediately upon being removed from nest or incubator. Do not allow sentiment or tender-heartedness to over rule good business ability or common sense. Weaklings and runts will not pay any dividends. Do not invest too much time and feed on such.

Now that hatching is over in many sections and will be over very shortly everywhere, the real important factor is feeding and care of the youngsters. The Department of Agriculture at Washington issues a circular on "First Care of Baby Chicks," G-30, which is very helpful.

Head lice on chicks is one of the drawbacks from now on. No let-up in fighting these pests should be allowed. There are many remedies on the market, but a little lard about the size of a pea, rubbed thoroughly on the head and neck is sufficient to rid the chick of these pests. This should be done after dark on a dry, warm night. Previous to this the coop, hen or brooder should be thoroughly attended to.

For your early laying pullets next fall don't take any chances. Always remember that the future to a large extent is the direct outcome of yesterday and today. One often hears the term "good luck" or "bad luck" in connection with hatchings or broodings, when as a matter of fact, luck good or bad, would be more properly termed good or bad management. If one is "unlucky" enough to forget to fill the pen or close the door against cats or rats, one may be unlucky enough to meet with losses. Unfortunately, luck does play a part once in awhile, both for good or bad. Careful, conscientious work, is the real factor for success in most every case, however.

### EASY TO MAKE EQUIPMENT TO LEAN DAIRY UTENSILS

One of the greatest conveniences on the farm where cows are kept is some means for heating an abundance of water for washing the milk vessels. Where a considerable number of cows are kept, heating water by means of steam, from a small low-pressure upright boiler is desirable, but on the small farm a stove with a basin fitted into the top (or it may be separate from the top) can be purchased cheaply and will serve the purpose, provided the water is properly heated. Water can be pumped from the well directly into the basin. In order to avoid heating the milk room and to do away with smoke and ashes, the water heater should be placed immediately outside the milk room, and if elevated the water from it can be run into the washing vat.

Some equipment is necessary in which to wash utensils used in handling milk. A vat is very convenient. One end of the vat can be used for washing and the other for rinsing and scalding.

Fibre brushes for washing milk utensils should replace the common dish rag, as they do better work and are more easily kept clean.

On many farms where as many as four or five cows are kept a cream separator is advisable, as will reduce the labor required in handling the milk from cows more than any other one thing.

A refrigerator or ice box is desirable upon every farm where either a few or many cows are kept if it is practicable to secure ice for summer.

### SEES BEST RESULTS FROM MONEY FOR BOYS' CLUBS

The United States Department of Agriculture, the State agricultural colleges, and other agencies for the promotion of better farming are spending considerable money in club work among boys.

Does it pay? Here is the opinion of Dr. Thomas F. Hunt, Dean and Director of the College of Agriculture, University of California:

"The College of Agriculture did not in my opinion, get as effective results from any other equal sum of money which it expended as it did from the amount of money spent on boys' clubs.

"These clubs have been running long enough for us to have some knowledge of their influence on the future lives of the boys concerned. I think I am well within the mark when I say that for the amount of money expended we get the greatest human results."

### MAKE USE OF MARKET REPORTS

Effectiveness of the Bureau of Markets' work along the various lines of meat and live stock reporting depends upon the extent to which the public utilizes the information that is made available. The whole purpose to be accomplished is to improve conditions in the live stock trade so that production will be encouraged, and, furthermore, to shorten the gap between producer and consumer.

Any unwarranted margin of profit on meat products can only lessen consumption and disturb values, say Department of Agriculture officials. It brings conflict between producing and consuming interests where none should exist.

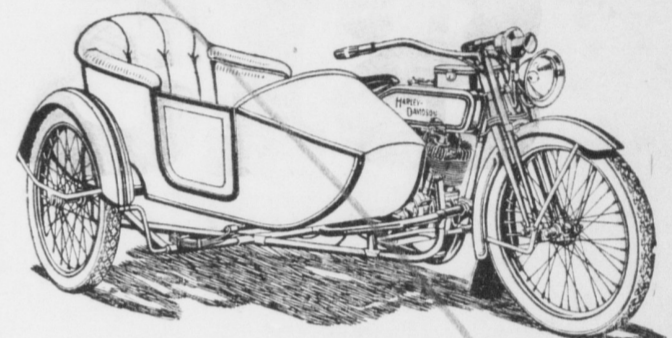
