GUARD WHEAT AGAINST RATS AND MICE

The greatest wheat crop ever produced in America will soon be har-vested. Grain elevators will soon ecome veritable treasuries which thieving rats and mice will break

into if they can.

Don't feed \$2.26 wheat to rats and mice, says the United States Department of Agriculture. Traps, poison and rat-proof construction will stop their raids.

The arch enemies of stored grain are dampness and rodent pestsrats and mice. An elevator with a leaky roof is only a little worse than one allowing free entry to rats and mice. The present price of wheat makes a telling appeal for rat-proof construction of wheat containers. Now is the time to fill rat holes with cement or cover them with sheet iron, and to build new mouse-proof granaries of either concrete or

granaries of either concrete or galvanized sheet iron.

Where rats and mice have plenty of food and are unmolested they multiply overwhelmingly. For exmultiply overwhelmingly. 
