The Prize Winners

In order to create interest in the parade, Otsego Tribe of this place offered a number of cash prizes with the understanding that no Tribe, band or float from Mt. Joy is eligible to compete. This was one of the features of the parade and there was keen competition. Three disinterested judges, neither of whom were Red Men, were appointed as follows: Messrs. M. C. Bowman, Jno. H. Parade Features

Some of the features of the parade were the nine young girls, all dressed in white, each wearing a red tie and a red sash or regalia, carrying a large American flag at the head of the parade, drew rounds of applause. The two jazz bands greatly amused the public, especially their costumes while the zig-zag and snake marching of the numerous Tribes appealed to many. The finest costumes ever seen in a parade here were worn by the Degree team of the Tribe from Columbia.

The Evening Meeting

Past Great Sachem Dr. J. J. Newpher presided at the evening session which was open to the public. The meeting started with a prelude by the orchestra, followed by the audience singing America. There was an address of welcome by the president after which Great Sachem Chas. E. Bell, of Philadelphia, delivered an able address, telling of the wonderful work that is being accomplished in this reservation by the order. The orchestra rendered a selection and Miss Kathryn Shire was obliged to respond to an encore, so well did her recitation please. Past Great Sachem Chas. R. Willets, of Harrisburg, outlined the manner in which the Improved Order of Red Men care for their orphans. In brief he stated that many organizations greet homes for the purpose, which is a wonderful work, but the Red Men, just a little different, care for all needy orphans of deceased brothers by weekly allowances per orphan. Each child under 14 years of age is cared for in that manner, permitting the mother to care for them and "keep the home together."

This work was started seven years ago and today the Improved Order of Red Men are spending nearly \$42,000 annually for the support of nearly 900 orphans in Pennsylvania. There was another selection by the orchestra after which Great Senior Sagamore Norman L. C. Troxell, the jovial Red Man of Allentown, greatly pleased all present with well chosen remarks. Brother Troxell is very original in his remarks, everybody and the remark that "fat men are good natured" is only too true in his particular case. His address, in which were interwoven many spicy remarks, together with good redmanship, kept the audience on edge all the while he held the floor. In his official capacity in the State organization he is exceeding the speed limit in regards to the excellent work he is daily accomplishing. Brother Troxell's maxim, "one deed of kindness every day" wins admiration for him wherever he goes. He is a warm friend of Rev. Snavely of this place, who was present at this meeting and offered the benediction which closed the most successful public meeting in the history of the county organization.

The Mount Joy Hall, in which the exercises and meetings were held, was very beautifully decorated, especially the stage, by the committee in charge. Our townspeople too, were very kind in displaying and decorating their homes and business places so beautifully.

The Executive Committee of the Free Highways Association and allied committees and representatives associated with it in the effort to abolish toll roads in Lancaster county, desire to express their gratification, and to commend your action in appropriating \$150,000 to purchase toll roads and in setting aside an additional \$50,000 for highway improvements.

The fact that this sum could be appropriated out of the surplus funds and still have remaining in the treasury nearly a quarter of a million dollars after full provision is made for the expenditures for the ensuing year, attests to the immense wealth of Lancaster County, and in itself confers an assurance that the question of the ultimate total abolition of our toll gates is easily within the financial ability of the county without any increase of taxation.

WILL LECTURE ON PARIS & VERSAILLES

Through the co-operation of the American Legion, Mount Joy, has secured a date for the illustrated lecture on Paris and Versailles, being given by Lieut. R. D. Coble, formerly of the French Army.

Lieut. Coble, who is thoroughly American, was originally engaged in the French Foreign Legion, later transfer to aerial observation, in the capacity of an observer taking photographs and regulating artillery fire by wireless from airplane. After the signature of the armistice, when the authorities on the other side were doing everything possible to distract the attention of the boys from the big question "When are we going home," Lieut. Coble was placed in charge of a service organized to show the City of Paris and the Palace of Versailles to the American "dough-boys" who chose to spend their leaves in France's greatest city. And, in the course of months of waiting that followed, it is estimated that, with the aid of his staff, he has talked to approximately forty-five or fifty thousand of our boys, on the very points of interest now being shown in his lecture.

Those who have heard Lieut. Coble talk declare that his intimate knowledge of the subject, his close sympathy with the viewpoint of the American left alone in a city whose language he cannot speak, and his ability to introduce into his lecture the humorous situations which result, make the evening entertaining as well as educational.

Over one hundred beautiful illustrations will be shown, all of which have been personally selected to cover the points of most interest, some of the views showing the American soldiers "taking in the sights," and those of the park and palace at Versailles, where peace was signed, being colored and presenting a true picture of the magnificent furnishings of the residence of the kings and queens of France.

In order that those who wish to do so may reserve places, an advance sale of tickets, for Mount Joy Hall, where Lieut. Coble will lecture Wednesday, Nov. 12th, will be conducted by American Legion Post No. 185 of Mount Joy, Pa., under whose auspices, and for whose benefit the lecture is being given.

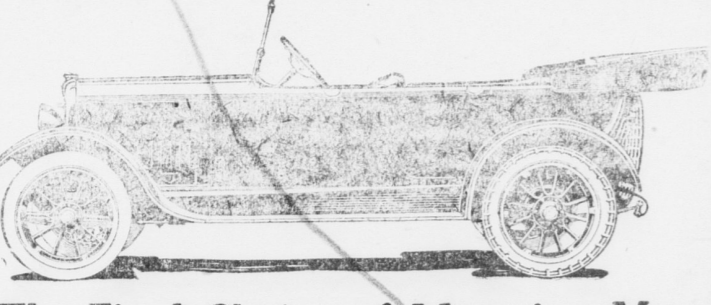
