TWO AUTO CRASHES AT ELIZABETHTOWN There were two automobile accidents Sunday night in the vicinity of Elizabethtown, in which three cars were wrecked, a horse killed and several persons injured. The first accident happened about 8 o'clock in the evening at the eastern end of the borough, opposite Abram Buch's manufacturing plant. Mr. and Mrs. Leander Gantz, living several miles north of here, were driving along the road when an automobile, containing three couples from York, which was being driven on the wrong side of the road, crashed into the team. The horse was pinned beneath the car and killed and the carriage was wrecked. Mrs. Gantz was cut and bruised and suffered from the shock. The occupants of the automobile were attended by Dr. J. P. Simons, of Elizabethtown. About 9 o'clock Sunday night another accident happened at Fisher's Hill, a little more than a mile east of Elizabethtown. Two cars belonging to residents of York, which were occupied by two men each, were in collision and both cars were wrecked. The men were cut about the face and were attended by Dr. Vere Treichler, of Elizabethtown. Licensed at Elkton Samuel M. Kulp, of Manheim, and Miss Minnie Stoner, of Mount Joy, were granted a marriage license at Elkton, Md., on Friday.

The farmers have been blessed with pleasant weather throughout this fall with a mammoth corn crop on hand. Quite a number have completed their corn husking, others are nearing the end. A large number of carloads of lime stone were dumped into the Pierce quarry by the state highway department in order to release the cars and later on they will put them through the crusher to be used on the concrete road east of this place. A number of automobile accidents occurred along the state highway on Sunday near this place which indicate that there are men at the wheel who should not be allowed to walk upon the crowded highway. Such men running at break neck speed put the caution men into great danger, while usually the careful drivers receive the greatest damage.
