FARMERS' COLUMN

Items in These Columns Are Preparep in the Department of Agriculture at Washington, D. C., and are Reliable and Trustworthy

With the approach of cold weather the thrifty farmer in almost any sec-tion of the country soon can under-take some form of fur trapping with profit. A knowledge of the fur-bear-ing animals found in his vicinity and how to catch them and treat their pelts reveals a sorce of income often overlooked. For the boy in the country nothing offers a more delightful diversion than a trapping expedition, particularly if it entails a money reward. Where the farm itself affords little opportunity for trapping, an accessible stream or wooded tract is generally to be found near-by where fur-bearing animals can be caught. While the country have been diminishing steadily, prices have been rising. The war also has been an important factor in this up-

SKUNK PELTS VALUABLE The skunk, one of the most comon fur bearers, is found in every ate of the Union. Large skunk ins probably will bring the trapper rom \$1 to \$5 this season, while the reasels, of one variety or another, to be found in practically all secons of the country. Formerly the prown pelts were considered worthless, but with the rise in fur prices brown pelts should net the trapper rom 10 to 25 cents each, while the white pelts will bring from 50 to kawfed em bubly ken frock.

An example of returns that can he people of Oregon netted approxinately \$50,000 from mole skins last ear, following trapping demonstra-Biological Survey of the United States Department of Agriculture. The demonstrations showed that while millions of European mole skins were used by fur manufacturers in America before the war, the skins of some American moles, especially the large, common variety of western Washington and Oregon, are larger and have better texture

than those from Europe. Farmers' Bulletin 832, published by the United States Department of Agriulture, describes the best kinds of nole traps, how to set them, and rive other information. The methods discussed are especially adapted to the Pacific Coast States, but with modifications will apply to all localities where moles are found.

MUSKRATS STILL NUMEROUS While minks, raccoons and skunks ave become somewhat scarce in ertain localities, muskrats have not liminished in numbers except in places where the marshes have been lrained. These animals multiply nuch more rapidly than many other ur bearers, and there habits are beter fitted to maintain their numbers nder reasonable protection. Muskat pelts this season should bring from 75 cents to \$2 each. Though the price of cotton-tail rabbit skins is low—15 cents to 35 cents a pound for dry cased skins—this source of income should not be overlooked by the trapper-farmer, as frequently a large number of these animals can be caught in the course of the winter. There is frequently a good market for rabbit meat also. Among other fur-bearing animals more or less widely distributed throughout the country are opossums, badgers, and thewestern regions, coyotes and low-15 cents to 35 cents a pound and thewestern regions, coyotes and Mfgrs., Buffalo, N. Y.

If the farmer who temporarily urns trapper is to realize the best prices for pelts, he must learn the proper methods of handling them. Most skins should be "cased" for the market. A cased skin is one removed from the carcass after slitting the mind legs but not the belly of the thereby leaving a tubularshaped pelt. The skin is left with the turned in, and dried on a stretchthe turned in, and dried on a stretch-er made of thin board sharpened to a point, or of heavy galvanized wire. 
