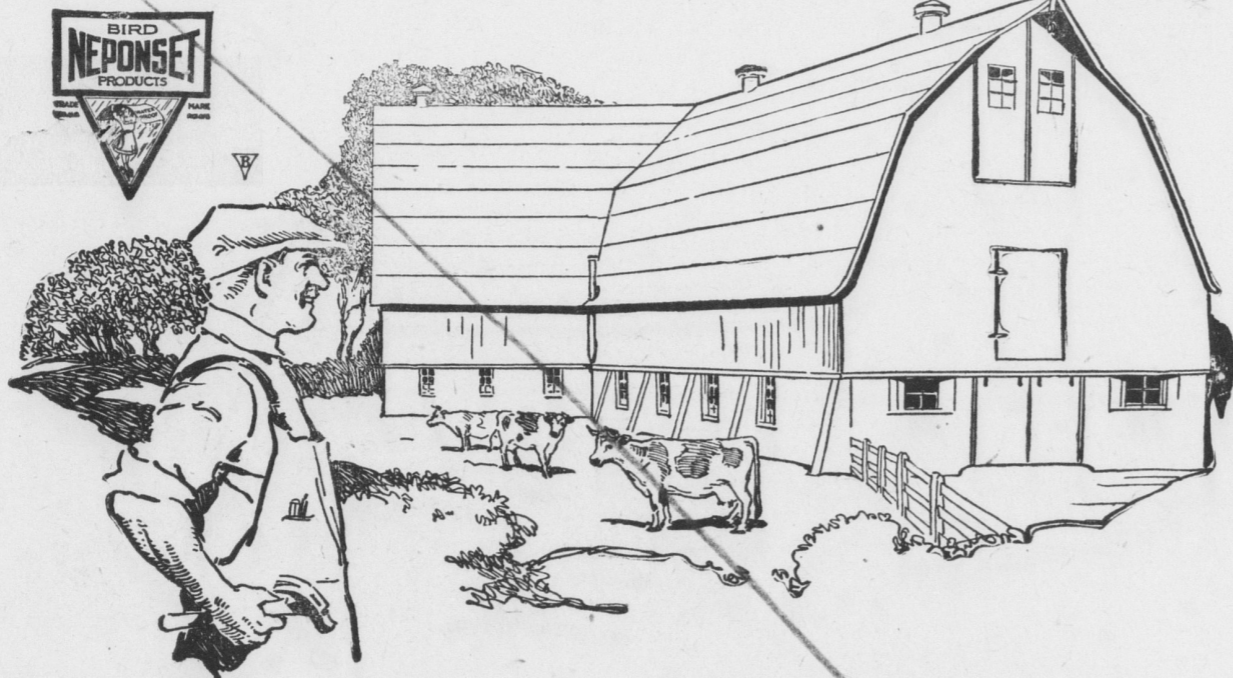

## DONEGAL REUNION WELL ATTENDED

can authorities whose data was accepted by Darwin. He also said that Dr. Haldeman recorded the fact that regularly the bald eagle nested on Chickies Rock.

Prof. Beck also related interesting things regarding J. J. Liphart, the Mariettian whose bird lists of the Donegal region and further limits are in both Rupp's and Mombert's histories of Lancaster county.

In his introduction, Prof. Beck touched upon the history of Old Donegal with its wonderful spring. The speaker imitated the calls of various birds. Speaking of the birds' homing instinct, he told how his grandfather, John Beck, had experimented with a purple martin—which birds go from this section to Brazil each winter season—by placing a mark upon a certain one. The identical bird returned to its haunt in Lancaster county the following year.

Prof. Beck related that the log of Captain John Smith, the Jamestown explorer and settler, told of a great abundance of birds he had found at Havre-de-Grace. The speaker said that many of the original species seen in these parts are now very rare. He said the passenger pigeon is entirely extinct, the very last one known having died several years ago in the Cincinnati zoological gardens.

This extermination of the bird has been very speedily explained Prof. Beck, telling how his great grandfather, B. Adam Grube, related that the beauty of an Easter sunrise church service he attended was eclipsed by the flocks of countless wild pigeons. The speaker also told how his father, Abram Beck, in the northern part of Lancaster county, and Dr. M. Raub, below Quarryville, had simultaneously observed great flights of passenger pigeons in 1846, when at 11 o'clock in the morning, the entire sky as far as the eye could see from zenith to the limits of the horizon was covered by these flying pigeons.

Prof. Beck stated that he had his first glimpse of the sky lark in Saxony, Germany, in 1904, at "Herrnhut," the estate of Count Zinzendorf, whose life was so closely linked with the early history of Lancaster county. The speaker touched in a general way upon the representative birds of the Donegal Valley, comparing them briefly with Old World species. He spoke of the Carolina parakeet, a bird now extinct, that in earlier days found its way into this section because the Carolina zone of bird life extends into the Susquehanna Valley.

Prof. Howard B. Grose, Jr., of Franklin and Marshall, presented a fine interpretation of the spirit that animated the Pilgrim Fathers, the ter-centenary of whose landing in New England will be observed in elaborate manner at Plymouth next fall.

The popular meeting in the evening was featured with addresses by Rev. Frank G. Bossert, of Roxborough, Pa. (who was pastor of Donegal church nearly a decade), and Rev. Francis J. S. Morrow, pastor of the Methodist church at Marietta.

**Materialism Now Rampant**  
Rev. Bossert spoke on "The Church in the Present Crisis." He said in part: "The great war has closed, yet the world is still in turmoil. The world is undergoing a change, and America also. Idealism was paramount when we went into the war, but now materialism is taking its place. Everything is being valued in terms of dollars and cents. The world is passing through a crisis. But after all, the church retains a great hold on the people; and a great obligation that rests with the institution today is to train the young in religious truths, for they are not now getting the instruction they should along these lines. It may be necessary to go back to the old academies of colonial days, supported by the churches. Ministers must be teachers as well as preachers. We must refuse to yield to the materialistic spirit and stand for self-sacrifice."

Need of Evangelism

Rev. Morrow's subject was "The Church Today." He said in part: "The church today faces a new world, and new conditions which demand our utmost attention. We must resolve that the old world conditions shall never occur again. Our task is to rebuild on new lines. To the church belongs the place of leadership. The church has too long loitered. We must rally round the leadership of Christ, with a devotion to His cause such as was manifested to God and country by the Donegal pioneers who met beneath the Witness Tree. The church today needs reconstructive and co-operative evangelism. The church stands for service and sacrifice. She needs no apology or defense. She has suffered because of an under-emphasis of essentials found in the gospel of Christ."

The music of the reunion was particularly enjoyed. Master Walter Sickles, of Harrisburg; W. Clyde Shissler and Samuel B. Smith, both of Lancaster, rendered fine solos. The quartet selections by Messrs. Shissler, Smith, Meister and Kendig were also highly pleasing.
