 Both the Curb and Central Markets were well stocked with choice fruits and vegetables and the usual crowd of buyers were present. Home-grown stock pre-dominated and was of excellent quality and condition. Peaches of choice quality and condition were plentiful and sold readily in 1/2 baskets. A goodly stock of corn, tomatoes and apples was offered and all other fruits and vegetables were in good supply. Eggs continue to advance in price but appear plentiful. Prices remain about the same as last week on most offerings.

COURT PROCLAMATION

Whereas, the Hon. Charles L. Landis, President, and Honorable Aaron B. Hassler, Associate Law Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Lancaster and Assistant Justices of the Courts of Oyer and Terminer and General Jail Delivery and Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Lancaster, have issued their precept to me directed, requiring me, among other things, to make public proclamation throughout my bailiwick, that a Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Jail Delivery, also a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace and Jail Delivery, will commence in the Court House, in the City of Lancaster, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

ON THE SECOND MONDAY IN SEPTEMBER (the 13th), 1920

in pursuance of which precept public notice is hereby given to the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Lancaster, in said county, and all the Justices of the Peace, the Coroner and Constables of the said City and County of Lancaster, that they be then and there, in their own proper persons, with their rolls, records and examinations, and inquisition; and their other remembrances, to do those things which to their offices appertain in their behalf to be done; and to all those who will prosecute against the prisoners who are or then shall be, in the jail of the said County of Lancaster, are to be then and there to prosecute against them as shall be just.
