



> THE PRICE IS BOUND TO TAKE FURTHER TUMBLES

There are \$330,000 tons of raw ugar in Cuba, says William A. Merchant of Havana, president of the National Bank of Cuba, and he warns growers against hoarding their production in the hope of better prices. There is no scarcity in the United States, he says, and it is the opinion of refiners that there will be a surplus here of 200,000 tons on December 31st. He adds that the best crop of the United States will probably be 200,000 tens greater than last year, and the best sugar crop of Europe is estimated at between 700,000 and 000,000 tons more than what it was in 1919.




