### THOROUGHbred STOCK SALE A BIG SUCCESS

The Mount Joy Breeders' sale held at the Farmers' Inn, last Tuesday is a part of history. It was attended by the leading breeders of the county and adjoining counties as well as those from a distance, New Jersey and Maryland. The animals consigned were nearly all young and came from herds that represent the leading strains of the Holstein breed. The top price was \$450 for a heifer calf consigned by A. H. Martin. A cow consigned by I. W. Musser was purchased by C. H. Kendig of Millersville, Pa., for \$345 and the calf by her side was purchased by W. T. Webb, of Quarryville, Pa., for \$71. The consigners for this sale were Messrs. C. A. Spahr, Salunga, Pa.; H. E. Burkholder, Bareville, Pa.; Albert Groff, East Petersburg, Pa.; H. E. Robertson, York, Pa.; H. L. Herr, New Danville, Pa.; I. W. Musser, I. T. Ginder, A. H. Martin, J. E. Eshleman, S. S. Graybill.

This was the first sale of the kind and was something new for many of those attending. The prices paid were low. Considering the conditions of the cattle market the sale was a success.

Those purchasing were beginners and done well by selecting foundation stock right at home. Seventeen of the animals in the sale averaged \$212. Many of the rest were calves. A good time to start in the pure bred stock is now when cattle are down at low a commercial value as they have been for some time. The consigners have sold not with the intention of closing out but to give others a chance to start at their own figures. Many have availed themselves of the opportunity and others regret that they didn't purchase. Col. Geo. Baxter of Elmira, New York, was the auctioneer and J. G. Kerrick of Towanda, Pa., was giving the pedigrees.

### WILL SELECT A SUCCESSOR TO HORACE HALDEMAN

The members of the Republican County Committee from the districts of Lancaster county in the Seventeenth Senatorial District met Tuesday in the Orphans' Court room at Lancaster.

The object of the meeting was to elect ten conferees to meet with Lebanon's conferees in Harrisburg on December 11 at noon to select a Republican candidate for Senator to be voted for at the special election on December 21, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Senator Horace L. Haldean, whose name was on the official ballot at the last election, but who died a few days before the election after the ballots had been properly certified, printed and issued to the election officers. Lancaster county is entitled to ten conferees and Lebanon to eight, the proportion meaning that Lancaster nomination will get the Senatorial nomination.

F. Dunlap, Manheim; John R. Shirk, West Cocalico; Harry C. Schock, Mount Joy; B. Frank Musser, Mountville; Hon. Robert S. Conklin, Columbia; Hon. M. R. Hoffman, Mountjoy; Hon. G. Graybill Diehm, Lititz.
