However, this year considerable ffort has been centered on the fight with the result that thus far there have been several public hearings before the Legislative committee having the bills in hand. Several other neetings are scheduled for the comng week. At the one on Tuesday elative to the fraternal organizations, there will be in attendance John G. presented them to the committee. These bills affect directly perhaps the greatest number of citizens of any legislation at Harrisburg this term of the Legislature. 
