Radiophone Music.

It appears very much as though we are on the verge of a new era in prayer service at 7:30 o'clock. radio communication, namely, radio phone music for the home. The idea, in brief, says the Scientific American is to have radiophone stations at central points sending out concert music as well as speeches and lectures via radio, and compact and simple radio receiving sets in various homes, clubs and so on to intercept the waves. Already there are several radiophone stations in operation, and at least one wireless company has developed a receiving set made in the form of a cabinet phonograph, incorporating a concealed loud-speaking telephone unit, so that the music, speech, lecture or other radiophone transmission can be heard throughout a room. It is believed by radio men that leading manufacturers of radio equipment will see fit to maintain radiophone concert

and lecture service for their patrons. Levied on Skunk for Fur. 
