A Fake Collector Caught at Lebanon

The State Police say, he made it a practice to visit farms and small towns ostensibly to solicit subscriptions, and by crafty conversation with persons he met, he induced them to show receipts of the periodicals coming to their places, and thus managed to collect on the accounts of such publications.

In the course of his travels he went to Lebanon county. The immense circulation of the Semi-Weekly News attracted his interest at once, for he found that it goes to most of the homes, and he proceeded to make collections right and left. He was enabled to work in secrecy for some time by the offer of a handsome atlas as an inducement for payment of subscription rates in advance, and thus swindled many people.

Attempts were made to locate the fellow for several days, and then the News enlisted the aid of the State Police, and on Friday, after following him all day, State Policeman Zeck and Snyder, of Corporal Taylor's force apprehended him at Hershey. Just now far he got with his nefarious operations cannot be told as yet but it is already known that they run into some hundreds of dollars. Fake receipts which he issued bear the signature of Rhul, Ream, Risser, Arnold, Rula and others names.

The State Police state that he confessed his guilt after his arrest, and also admitted that he operated in Lancaster, Dauphin and other adjoining counties. He implicated a man by the name of William Barret, and the State Police are now on that trail although it has not yet been ascertained that he really had a partner.

The accused was taken before Alderman R. L. Miller, who committed him to jail for a hearing. When arrested Barnhart is said to have stated that he tried to make an honest living and then gave it up and took to the faking process. He is said to come from a good family at Elizabethtown. He said he and his partner had agreed that they had gone about the limit for this region and were preparing to leave for Florida. Any of our patrons who have been swindled, wishing to start prosecution against the fellow can do so by writing to Sheriff Brunner at Lebanon and get his name, make the complaint before a Justice of the Peace in Dauphin Co. and have a detainer lodged against him at the Lebanon jail and prosecute him after he has served his time at Lebanon. The name that he signed on the receipts for the money was an assumed name.

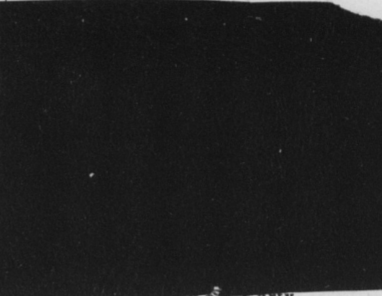

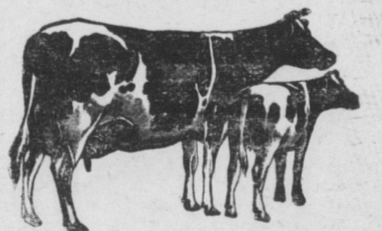

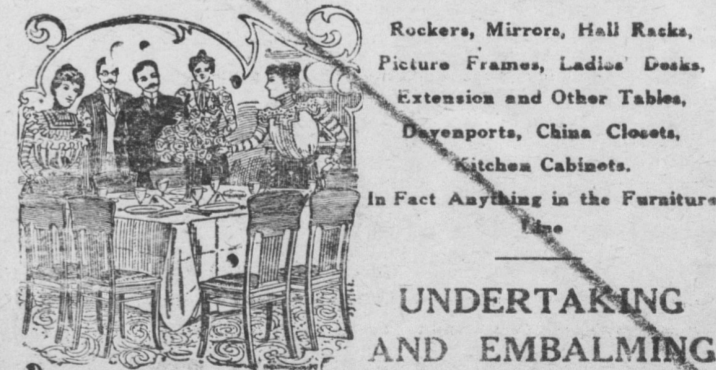
