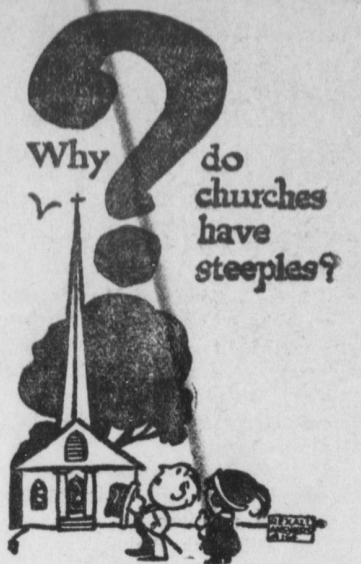

HOME HEALTH CLUB. WEEKLY LETTER WRITTEN EXPRESSLY FOR THE BULLETIN BY DR. DAVID H. REEDER.

Actual Economy: Sickness is one of the most expensive as well as the most useless things we buy. Yes I mean it. We buy our sick days and pay much more for them than we pay for the well days, and then we must pay the doctor and lose valuable time in order to get back to the well days.

Now if it is necessary to have a doctor forty times each year, and not only lose forty days time for the sick person but also another forty days time for the person who cares for the sick, then we certainly do have an enormous loss.

I have before me the personal statement of a very famous physician who does me the honor of addressing me as "Dear Friend" when he writes to me, and in his statement he tells me of the diet which he gave to a wealthy patient that had been treated previously by many famous physicians and in many great sanitariums and hospitals.

On the morning of the fourth day, he juice of half a lemon in a tumbler of cold water, no sugar. One or two later one glass of orange juice, nothing more. At noon a double handful of watercress, nothing more, and for supper, a head of lettuce, nothing more.

This diet and nothing else was continued for ten days and then a few other vegetables were added for another ten days. Very little change was made for the third ten days, but he was well, strong, vigorous and had a clear mind.

DOMESTIC MARKET FOR DURUM WHEAT IS ON THE INCREASE. Because the foreign demand for durum wheat is falling off and the domestic demand is on the increase, farmers are urged by the United States Department of Agriculture to modify their durum-wheat production to fit the needs of the domestic market.

Certain durum wheats, chief among which is the Pentad or red durum variety, have been grown quite extensively, and while absorbed on the foreign market should be discontinued and replaced with varieties suited to domestic milling for macaroni manufacture.

When making a change of seed, careful consideration should be given to the choice of varieties to be used. The Kubanka is the best-adapted variety for all the varying conditions in the durum-wheat sections.

COLLEGE DAIRY ANIMAL AWARDED SILVER MEDAL. Penstages Pogis Hattie, a three-year-old Jersey in the dairy herd at the Pennsylvania State College, has just completed a year's record of milk production that places her as the fourth highest cow in her class in Pennsylvania.

COW-TEST RECORDS SHOW VALUE OF PUREBRED BULLS. A tabulation has just been completed by the Bureau of Animal Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, in which the records of 384 grade daughters of pure-bred dairy bulls were compared with the records of their dams.

States is only 160 pounds annually. The records of the dams were arranged in five groups according to production of butterfat. These five groups averaged 100, 200, 300, 400 and 500 pounds, respectively.

From these figures we may conclude that good purebred bulls are needed for every dairy herd and that purebred bulls selected from very high producing ancestry are required when the production records of the dams are above 300 pounds of butterfat a year.

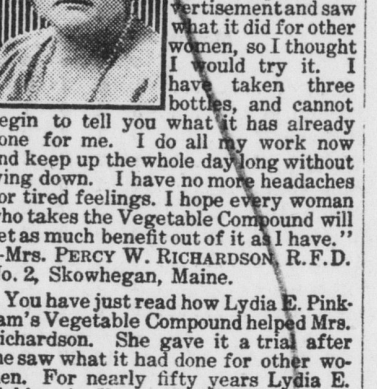
