ELECTION NOTICE INCREASE OF INDEBTEDNESS NOTICE is hereby given to all the electors of the School District of the Borough of Mount Joy, County of Lancaster, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in pursuance and by authority of a resolution of the Board of School Directors of the said School District, passed the 20th day of September, A. D. 1924, that a public election will be held on Tuesday, the fourth day of November, 1924, between the hours of seven o'clock A. M. and seven o'clock P. M., at the Washington House, in the West Ward, and at McGinniss Hotel (Ed. Ream's Building, East Main Street) in the East Ward, in the said Borough of Mount Joy, the usual places for holding the municipal elections in said School District of the Borough of Mount Joy, for the purpose of obtaining the assent of the qualified electors of the said School District to an increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District.

The Board of School Directors, being the corporate authorities of the said School District, by a resolution duly passed by the unanimous affirmative vote of all the members of the said Board of School Directors, on the nineteenth day of September, 1924, duly recorded on the minutes of the said Board of School Directors, showing how each member voted, have signified their desire for such increase of indebtedness, agreeably to the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved the twentieth day of April, A. D. 1874, P. L. 65, and the amendments thereof and supplements thereto. The amount of the last assessed valuation of taxable property in said School District is \$1,213,860.00. The total amount of the existing debt of said School District is \$14,000.00. The amount of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District is \$70,000.00. The percentage of the proposed increase in the bonded indebtedness of the said School District, computed upon the last assessed valuation, is 5.76—100%.
