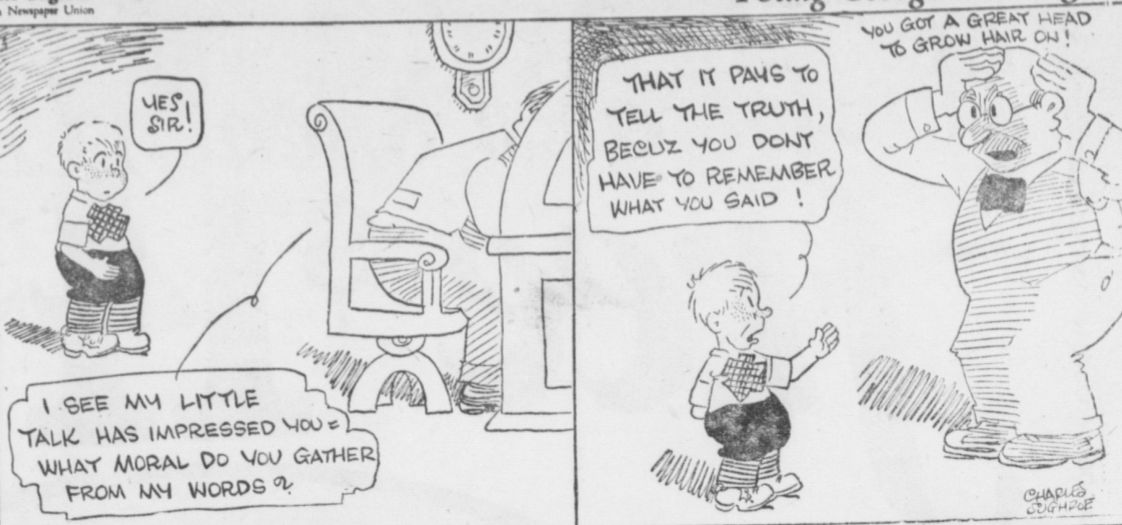

36 AN ORDINANCE THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY

PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF AMUSEMENTS, ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE

SECTION 1—The Council of the Borough of Mount Joy does hereby enact that from and after the passage and approval of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, natural or artificial, to conduct any performance, exhibition, circus, show, entertainment, festival, carnival or amusement, of any kind whatsoever, where money is demanded for admission, or is obtained directly or indirectly as the result of such amusement, or in the conducting of such amusement, within the Borough of Mount Joy, without having first obtained, from the Burgess of the said Borough, a permit to conduct the same, and having paid the license fee herein provided for; provided that no license or permit shall be granted for any exhibition, performance or entertainment, or any amusement herein provided for, unless the same have a moral and decent tendency.

SECTION 2—Before obtaining a permit as aforesaid, there shall be paid to the Burgess, for the use of the Borough of Mount Joy, the following fees:

For every license to exhibit any circus, show or carnival of a traveling nature, operated or conducted under canvas, the sum of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars, or providing, where such exhibition shall continue for more than one day, the license fee shall be seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) per day subsequent to the first day.

SECTION 3—If any person or persons, natural or artificial, their individual capacity, or as a firm or corporation, shall perform or exhibit any play, show, spectacle, exhibition, circus, festival, carnival, performance, or any entertainment, of any kind whatsoever, where money is demanded for admission, or money is realized by reason of such performance or entertainment, in any form whatsoever, without obtaining such license as required by this Ordinance, he, she or they, or the Chief Burgess, or before any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, shall pay to the Borough Treasury, a fine of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), for each offense, and in default of payment of the said fine, by imprisonment in the Lancaster County Prison for a period of thirty (30) days.

SECTION 4—Further providing that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not be construed to prevent any citizen from establishing a regular museum of natural or artificial curiosities, of a moral character, for the promotion of Science, nor shall any license fee be charged for any performance or entertainment, where the proceeds are devoted exclusively to charitable, religious or educational purposes; provided, further, however, that a license shall be required in such instance, though the fee shall not be charged.

Dog Owners Read This Carefully

(Continued from page one.) wearing a collar, inscribed and tagged as before mentioned, pursuing small game or protected birds during what is known as the closed season, may be killed by the owner or lessee of any land upon which such dog may be found, or by any officer of the State whose duty it is to protect the game of the State, when such dog is seen upon the track of such game, after notice, in writing, from that particular person or from the secretary of the board, has been to the owner or reputed owner or person in control of such dog, to the effect that the dog in question is in the habit of destroying or pursuing or following upon the track of game or protected birds contrary to law. Any person who shall knowingly or negligently permit his dog or a dog under his control to pursue small game during the close season, on land other than his own, or which he may control, shall be liable, without notice of any kind, to a penalty of ten dollars for each day small or protected birds may be pursued in violation of this section, and to an additional penalty of five dollars for each such animal or bird killed by such dog without the aid or direction of its master, together with costs of prosecution.

During the period between one hour before sunrise and 10 o'clock p. m., dogs, when accompanied by and under control of their owner or handler, may be trained upon any game in this State, excepting elk or deer or wild turkey, from the 20th day of August to the last day of February next following, Sundays excepted, so long as no firearms usually raised at arm's length and fired from the shoulder are carried and no injury is inflicted upon said animals or birds. This section does not prohibit the training of dog on raccoons during the nighttime. "Under Control" is hereby defined to mean within call except when actually on a trail or track of legal game.
