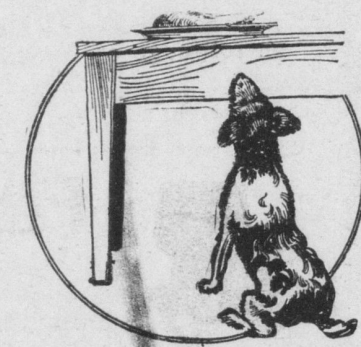

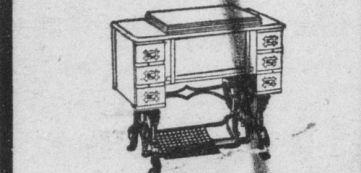

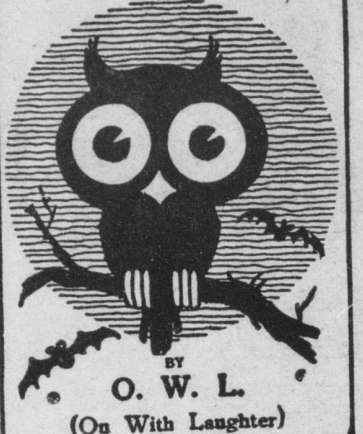

**WILL FORM IZAAK WALTON LEAGUE HERE FRIDAY NIGHT**  
Owing to lack of numbers of sportsmen deferred action upon forming a local chapter of the Izaak Walton League until a meeting to be held Friday, August 13 in Stumpf's restaurant.

Every man who is interested in hunting and fishing is asked to attend this meeting at which plans will be discussed for organizing an Izaak Walton League chapter. The local chapter will also embrace Florin.

Elizabethtown sportsmen planned on Friday night at a meeting in the Hotel Kennebec to install a chapter and right now are conducting a membership campaign in their own town to get the original twenty-five charter members.

Kenneth S. Thomas, for four years city editor of The Patriot at Harrisburg, will be here next Friday to explain the purposes and accomplishments of the Izaak Walton League.

Local sportsmen in informally discussing plans for a local chapter are considering the feasibility of restocking Little Chickies creek with pickerel after making sure that the stream is not polluted. The Izaak Walton League is the only national sportsmen's association in America and has a membership of more than 400,000. Plans are underway now to form chapters in every town in Pennsylvania. Already ninety-one chapters are functioning. During the past week chapters were started at Middletown, Elizabethtown, New Bloomfield, Newport, Millersburg and Palmyra.

It is estimated there are 150 hunters and fishermen in this territory eligible for membership in the Izaak Walton League.
