"The tracks were very plain im essions about one-half inch deep in rock which was no doubt formed man hundreds of years ago by the flow o water depositing silica on the rive bank from what is now an extinct gey ser or hot spring high up on the bank or it may have been that there wer closer springs, for the ground is ver hot within a few feet of the exposed tracks.

Earth Cracks Cause Leakage From Reservoir.

New York.—The New York city anean cracks, which are slowly drain ng the \$160,000,000 Ashokan reseroir in the Catskill mountains, th New York Herald-Tribune says. Th eservoir is twelve miles long and 226 N. Market St., three miles wide.

A recent survey, the newspape says, supports the theory that milions of gallons are seeping away arough the veins and thence to the urface again in adjacent water ourses. The reservoir, described as rivaling the Panama canal as an enineering achievement, is virtually npty. There has been no lack of ain, however, and feed streams are flush from bank to bank.
