"BEST SELLERS" AMONG PENNSYLVANIA APPLES

The "best sellers" among apples produced in Pennsylvania are the Stayman, Jonathan, Delicious, Baldwin and Rome, according to a survey of 291 retail stores in 10 cities made by the State Bureau of Markets during February and March. These five varieties were handled by more than three-fourths of the stores. This fact prompts the bureau to say that "the apple grower who has most or more of these varieties is indeed fortunate because he is assured of a good market at home."

The survey revealed other important facts regarding the marketing of Pennsylvania-grown winter apples.

The most popular grade of eastern fruit was the U. S. No. 1. Nearly every store that sold eastern apples reported that it handled some of this grade.

Most of the dealers stated that the display of apples in their windows decidedly increased the volume of their apple sales.

Because of more business, difficulty in handling and greater danger of misrepresentation, the barrel pack is plainly losing favor among buyers. Although out of 291 stores 153 reported that they bought barreled apples, many of these did so only because good bushel apples could not be obtained in the market.

A total of 273 stores or 94 per cent of those surveyed, reported that they were selling Pennsylvania apples, and that the general quality and pack of the eastern apples was better than a year ago.

"However, more uniformity in packing eastern apples is certainly needed," the report states: "Every retailer who handles western box apples buys them with complete confidence because he knows how many apples are in the package that he buys and also because he knows from experience that the fruit is uniform from top to bottom. Eastern grown apples because of their excellent flavor would command much higher prices in leading markets were they more uniformly packed. A package containing uniformly sized, colored and graded fruit would soon create an excellent market for eastern apples."

WILL ORGANIZE BABY BEEF CLUB FOR THIS YEAR

Arrangements are now being made for the organization of a second Lancaster County Beef Club, similar to the one which so successfully sold and showed their animals at the State Show in January. Every effort will be made to purchase and deliver the animals into the hands of the future owners before the first of May. Any farm boy or girl in the county between the ages of 10 and 16 years of age by the first of June will be eligible to membership. The membership, however, for this county will be limited to not over about 125 on account of the lack of space available for the sale of the animals at the next State Show at Harrisburg.

In getting the club under way, much the same plan will be followed as last year. In each community that has asked for this work, a local unit of the club will be formed, each unit to be supervised by a local leader. The leader for the Mount Joy section of the county is Hiram Nissly, Mt. Joy, Pa. Any boy or girl of the above age who desires to feed a baby beef this year should call or write to either Mr. Nissly or to the County Agent, Woolworth Building, Lancaster, Pa., before April 15th.

CONTROL OF STATE'S WORST WEEDS DESCRIBED

Among the most troublesome and destructive weeds prevalent in Pennsylvania, according to Dr. E. M. Gress, State Botanist, are: Canada thistle, plantain, chicory, false flax, field pepper grass, horse nettle, garlic, winter cress, cockle, perennial or field sow thistle, quack grass, clover dodder, morning glory, and hawkweeds.

"These weeds along with many others cause an estimated annual loss of \$2.00 per tillable acre of land," Dr. Gress asserts.

"Farmers are doing much and can do more to eliminate this loss by sowing clean seed, by allowing no weeds to mature seed, by rotating crops and by keeping everlastingly after the weeds. The coming summer will be just as favorable for growing weeds as for farm crops and unless farmers conduct a vigorous campaign against weeds the usual loss from weed growth will be suffered."

Dr. Gress has assembled all the latest methods for controlling the worst weeds in Pennsylvania. This information is now available in printed form as Bulletin 416 of the State Department of Agriculture at Harrisburg.

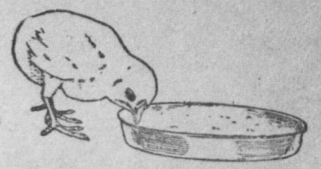

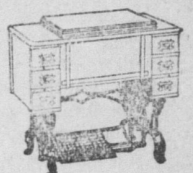
