EXTRA Dry dust from the treated gran is liable to sift into all parts of the mechanism of the grain drill and it is advisable, after drills hat set over night and before throwing them into mar, to turn feed shaft with a wrench to free feed sheels and avoid possible gear breekers instead of the short form and avoid possible gear breakage, just a shove forward by taking hold of the wheels may be sufficient to avoid any damage.
