Scotch Women for Bobs

Glasgow.-Close to \$100,000,000 a year is spent by women and girls on bobbing and shingling in Scotland, according to James Stewart, the "hairdresser" M. P. for St. Rollox, and as a consequence, he says, a new occupation has been started which employs many thousands of men and women.

"I am sure women will not return to the long hair fashion, because the present mode is so comfortable and hygienic," he went on. "Shingling is as popular with the women of the mining villages as it is with the women of Mayfair."

In England the cost of treatment of the hair varies from 35 cents in the working class village to \$125 in the fashionable salons of London. Some rich women think \$25 to \$125 quite normal expenditure for hair treatment at one session, but such extravagance is abnormal.

"The average woman probably spends about \$6 to \$8 a year on haircuts," Stewart concluded, "which compares favorably with the expense of the average man on shaving, haircuts, and shampoos."
