

BLACK CURRANT IS NURSE OF WHITE PINE BLISTER RUST

The European black currant i a public nuisance, because it acts as an advance guard in spreading the white pine blister rust, a disease of foreign origin which is destructive to all of our American white (or five-leafed) pines, says Samuel send our surplus capital to all parts B. The blister rust requires two distinctly different kinds of host plants for completing its life cycle. 
