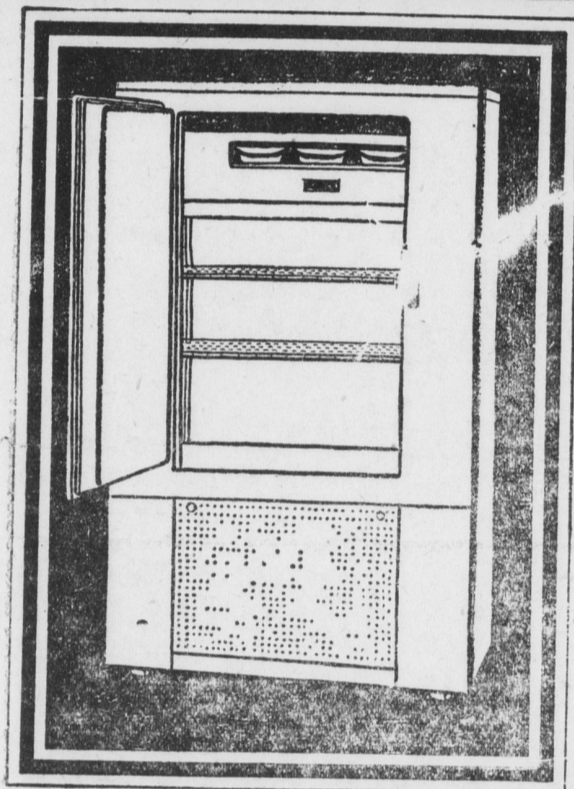

Hoffman found the body when he went to the corn shed to get the young man to assist him in unloading. He notified Hiram Paules, who tenants the farm and the two men extricated the body from the machinery.
It is believed that Schlegelmilch was knocked against the wheel of the tractor while he was in the act of backing the machine into the corn shed, in order to attach a harrow.
Schlegelmilch celebrated his 34th birthday anniversary on Sunday. He was born in Marietta, the son of the late Francis X. and Anna Schlegelmilch. He was a veteran of the World War, a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, Marietta, and of the Holy Name Society, of Lancaster county.
Besides his mother, he is survived by three sisters and a brother, Miss Elizabeth, instructor in music at Chambersburg; Miss Isabelle, at home; Mrs. Anna Sloat, Philadelphia, and Claire.

No Open Hunting Season This Year

This specification virtually restricts the game to does as bucks usually grow antlers at that weight, the commission said.

The killing of deer with visible antlers will entail a fine of \$100 for each animal.
For a year or more complaints have been received of the damage caused crops by the female deer which have multiplied much faster than the males. It was the desire of the commission to equalize the bucks and does in agreeing on the new ruling.
A previous decision providing for the shooting of does by expert marksmen, appointed by the state, in districts where depreations of crops has been extensive, met with much opposition.

The commission also broke a precedent by ruling that there will be a week-end season on ruffed grouse, bob-white quail, woodcock, male ring-neck pheasants and grey, black and fox squirrels, from October 15 to November 30 in 1928. In past years these game could be shot in limited numbers of any day during the season but this year the commissioners have declared that the season shall be from October 15 to November 30 and shall consist of a three day open season.
These days are Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
The same week-end season will also be in force for cottontail rabbits and hares from October 15 to December 1, there will be a six day open season. Bears also can be shot on Thursday, Friday and Saturday from the first of November to the first of December when a six day open season will be declared until the 15th of the month.

A closed season was declared on Hungarian partridges and an open season was ruled for racoons from October 15, to November 30, although the season's bag has been limited to 15 animals. The open season for trapping racoons will be

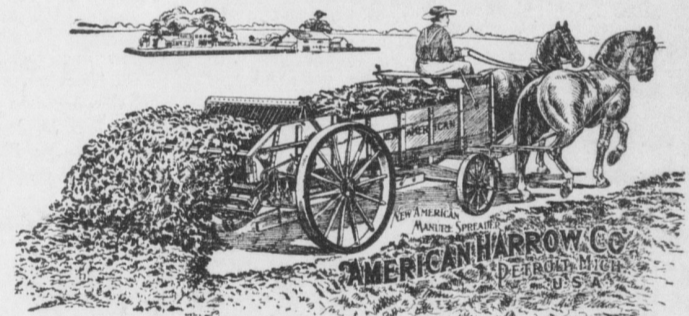
