## Whole Family Likes This Basement



WITH THE DANCE!" is the order of the evening in the home that has a music room all fitted up in the basement. No rugs have to be rolled up nor furniture moved, nor are the more serious members of the family disturbed in their reading or serious conversations upstairs. But every one who knows the latest steps or wants to hear the most pepful jazz or see the latest movie finds his way down to the dance room and home theater

that was once just a cluttered half of the basement. Not every basement lends itself to such an arrangement but many of them do and thoughtful builders are making provision for this in new homes. The plan shown here is taken from an actual house and is practicable in

The heating plant, of course, has right of way in every basement, as upon this depends the comfort and health of the entire family. The Holland warm air heating system should be placed as near to the center of the house as possible and close to the fuel room, which, in turn, is located with a view to being filled conveniently from the outside. Then economy demands that the laundry tubs be placed underneath the kitchen or bathroom so that the supply pipes and waste stack may be tapped at a minimum of cost. The rest of the basement may be partitioned off for storage and recreational purposes. The dance room shown here is kept warm and dry by the furnace. The coal bin is large enough to contain a winter's supply of fuel at a single filling,


for the Holland vapor-air system operates so efficiently that it requires a minimum of coal. This furnace will bring a night-cooled house up to 70 or 72 degrees of warmth on a midwinter morning after the draft has been open less than an hour. That is, it requires a minimum steady moderate combustion which eats into the coal pile.

Not only the basement, but the entire house, profits from the fact that the Holland heating plant holds its heat for hours. This makes for real comfort, and another feature of the equipment that contributes to comfort and good health is

the new type of humidifier which is an integral part of the vapor-air plant. Whereas the water-pan in the ordinary warm air furnace evaporates a gatlon of water a day, the humidifier in this heater consumes from three to twentyfive gallons a day, maintaining a relative humidity of 40 per cent, which scientists and heating and ventilating authorities agree is ideal for the

# Basement Is Place for Sewing Room



SEWING ROOM in the basement is an ideal arrangement because it A SEWING ROOM in the pasement is an ideal does not take up valuable space upstairs and is, if anything, even does not take up valuable space upstairs and is, if anything, even handier than a second-floor location. Such a room may be made light, warm, attractive and convenient. Also, it is close to the laundry where the ironing board and iron may be kept ready for pressing without interruption of the seamstress' work.

An excellent basement layout, conforming to an actual house plan, is shown here. The Holland warm air furnace is placed near the center of the house. The coal bins are close to it and on the driveway side, convenient for filling. The laundry tubs are beneath the plumbing upstairs. Note the amount of storage space for wood, garden tools and preserves.

All these several features are possible in the average basement if a warm air heating plant of modern type is installed. The latest model of Holland furnace is one which embodies a new invention, a fan unit which moves the air at a much higher velocity than the force of gravity, which is the propelling force in the old-style heater.

This style of heating plant is designed attractively and finished in red and black-a far cry from the unsightly appearance of the ordinary dwellinghouse heater. Furthermore, its over-all dimensions are less than the space occu-

pied by the ordinary warm air furnace and its intake pipe. For this reason, such a plant will allow ample room for all the basement accommodations shown here without any difficulty.

The sewing room is partitioned off with either matched lumber or wallboard. It will be more attractive if the masonry

walls are painted and floor joists above are covered with wallboard. A fine treatment for the floor would be battleship linoleum, cemented down and varnished. Or a thick rug might be put down. But if these things are too costly, it might be well to use inexpensive rag rugs of attractive light colors. A heat

lead from the furnace to the sewing room will supply ample heat to keep it comfortable, and in the summer it

probably will be one of the coolest rooms in the house. By all means build in a set of shelves to hold the boxes and baskets of sewing materials. An old chest of drawers, enameled in an attractive color. makes a splendid piece of sewing room furniture.
