CLASSIFY PRODUCE FOR STATE CANNERS

Nearly nine million pounds of tomatoes, apples and grapes were classified by State inspectors upon delivery at canning factories in the Commonwealth Bureau of Markets. This is the result of a movement fostered by the Pennsylvania Canners' Association to improve the quality of the canned goods thru the use of higher quality raw products.

By this method of purchasing raw produce, the canner pays a premium on the higher grades, thus encouraging the production of better quality products and the delivery of the best grades at the canning factory. Under the system of flat-rate purchases, the grower who has produced the higher quality products has not received increased compensation for the extra care and expense involved and at the same time the canner has injured the quality of his finished product by using the poorer grades of raw product delivery by many growers.

Several canners who were questioned about the outcome of this system of purchasing, reported that they would never again buy any other way. They are convinced that the only way to buy their raw products is by grade and that they can well afford to pay big prices for the best grade. Farmers questioned about the plan report that it will pay bigger returns to grow higher quality stock if the canners will pay a premium for quality.

Accidents Expensive While humanitarian reasons should be sufficient to make accident reduction an important factor in every business organization there is, in addition, the fact that accidents cost industry approximately \$5,000,000 annually.

An authority on the subject states that 88 per cent of all industrial accidents can be prevented through enforcement of proper safety rules and that 10 per cent result from improper physical conditions in plants. Unpreventable accidents constitute only two per cent of the total.

THANKSGIVING DAY

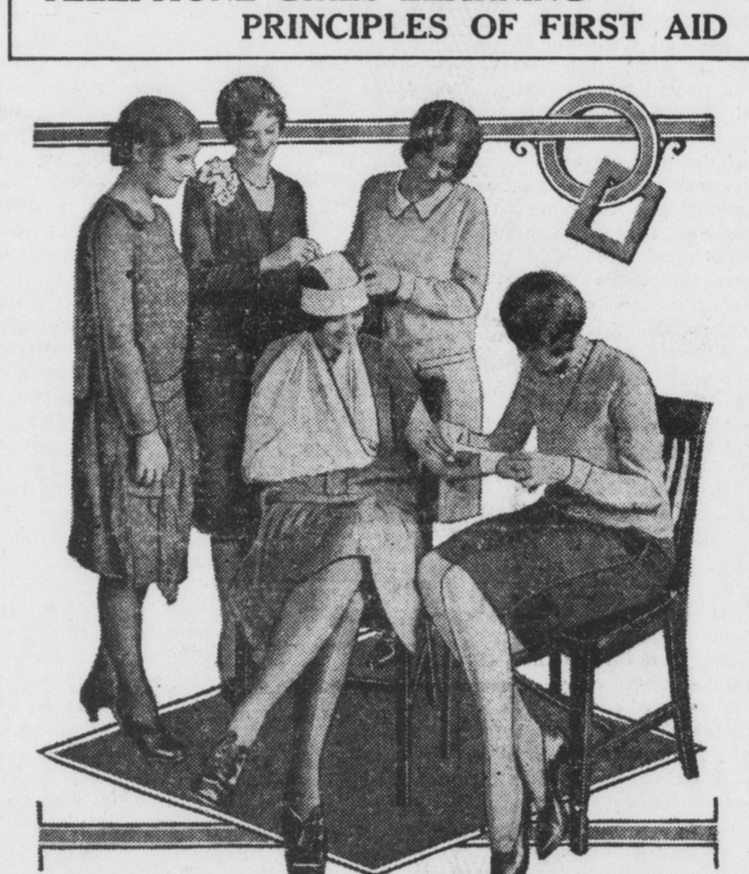

A Dollar Dinner For Four

Meat Loaf Fried Potatoes Rolls and Butter Peach Mold and Marshmallow Creme Pea and Corn Succotash Coffee

"A man seldom thinks with more earnestness of anything than he does of his dinner," stated a famous writer. And the housewife seldom thinks with more earnestness of anything than she does of the cost of her dinner. So here is a delicious meal that can be prepared for a dollar and will serve four people—certainly an occasion for joyful thoughts for both the husband and his wife. The cost of the dinner is about about forty cents and the fried potatoes, and the rolls and butter will be ten cents each. For the succotash take half a number 2 can of corn and half a number 1 can of peas and heat them in two tablespoons of bacon fat. The cost will be about thirteen cents.

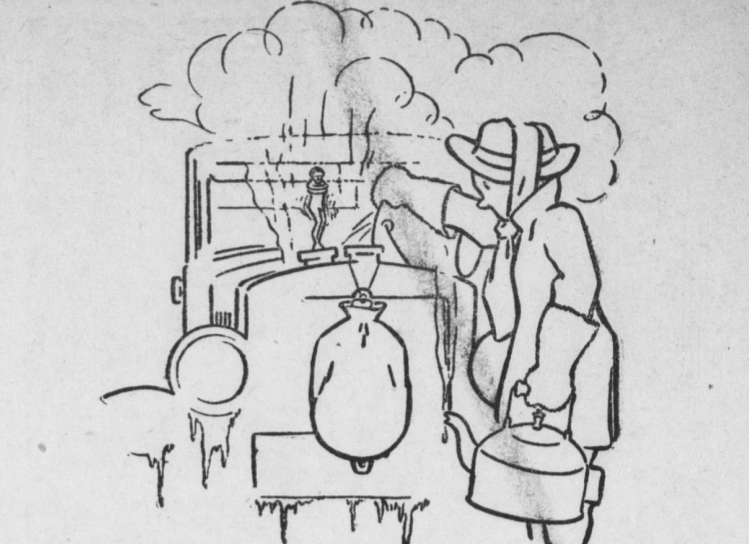
