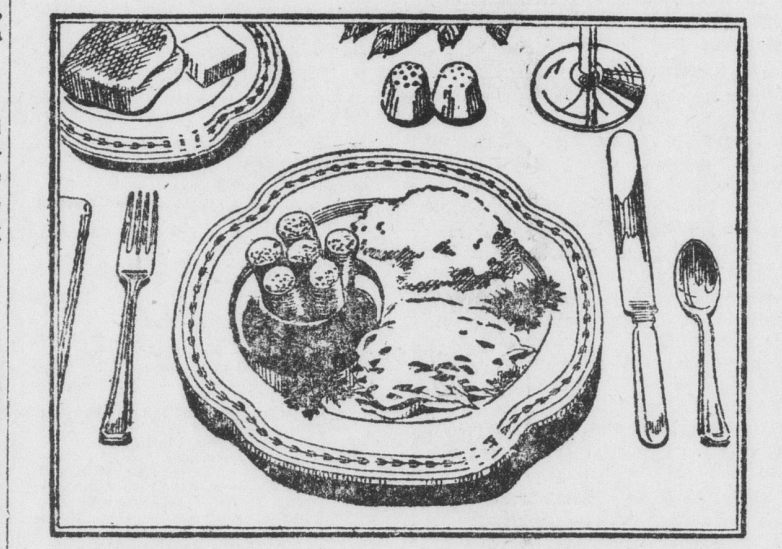

A Meal On One Dish



THE newest thing in the planning of one's meals is to have them a one-dish affair. That is, the entire meal course is served in the kitchen, and the plates arranged with the food brought into the dining room. Often such a meal is served at luncheon and is a complete meal in itself. But with the addition of a cocktail or soup and a dessert it becomes more formal.

Typical Menu Fresh Fruit Compote Apples Stuffed with Vienna Sausages Savory Corn Cakes Hot Roll Hot Cabbage Salad Apple Betty Coffee To prepare the apples, scoop out their cores, leaving the bottoms intact. Fill the centers with tiny canned Vienna sausages, about six to an apple, placed on end. Put in a covered baking dish with half a cup of water. Bake until apples are tender and delicious. In making savory corn add to two cups of canned corn, two well-beaten eggs, two tablespoons chopped, canned pimiento, two tablespoons melted butter, three-fourths cup milk, and salt and pepper. Pour into a buttered baking dish and cover the top with buttered crumbs mixed with an equal amount of grated cheese. Bake in a moderate oven until set and browned on top. Hot cabbage salad is prepared by slicing one-half a cabbage as for cole-slaw. Make a dressing by mixing two slightly beaten egg yolks, one-fourth cup cold water, one tablespoon butter, one-fourth cup hot vinegar, one-half teaspoon salt, one-fourth teaspoon mustard and a dash of pepper; stir in the top of a double boiler until thick. Add the cabbage and stir until heated.
