They first appeared In Europe during the Fourteenth century, evidently having entered through the Arabs or Saraeens, who may have learned their use from the gypsies. The earliest cards were painted, but the art of printing cards was discovered by the Germans about 1360, and the modern figures on the cards are said to have been invented in France between 1430 and 1461. The popularity of card games grew rapidly during the Fifteenth century, in spite of government edicts against them and crusades to stop gaming.

Where only a efw plants are growing in the lawn, they can be removed by hand-digging. If plentiful, each plant should be cut with a hoe and the fresh surfac treated with crude carbolic acid.
