"Shall the Council of the Borough of Mount Joy assess, levy and collect an annual tax of two mills on the dollar, or two dollars per thousand, on all taxable property in the Borough, the proceeds whereof shall be applied to the maintenance or aid in the maintenance of a free, non-sectarian, public library to be established in the said Borough by deed or gift of Henry G. Reist, the Borough to be represented by at least two members on the board having control of the affairs of such library, and such tax not to be levied until such library shall have been established?"
