"CONSERVE THE WINTER EVERGREENS," SAYS DR. GRIER According to Dr. Norman MacDowell Grier, of Elizabethtown College, Chairman for Lancaster County of the Wild Flower Preservation Society of America, the following materials are suggested for wreath construction during the holiday season, viz., Aucuba, arbutus, box, honeysuckle, ivy, periwinkle, privet, red cedar, white pine, pine cones. On the other hand the American holly, laurel, Christmas fern, club mosses or ground pines, partridge berry and winter berry should be protected.

It is not generally known that the recent trespass law of Pennsylvania provides severe penalties for those who wilfully and unlawfully remove the wild plant life from the land of another.
