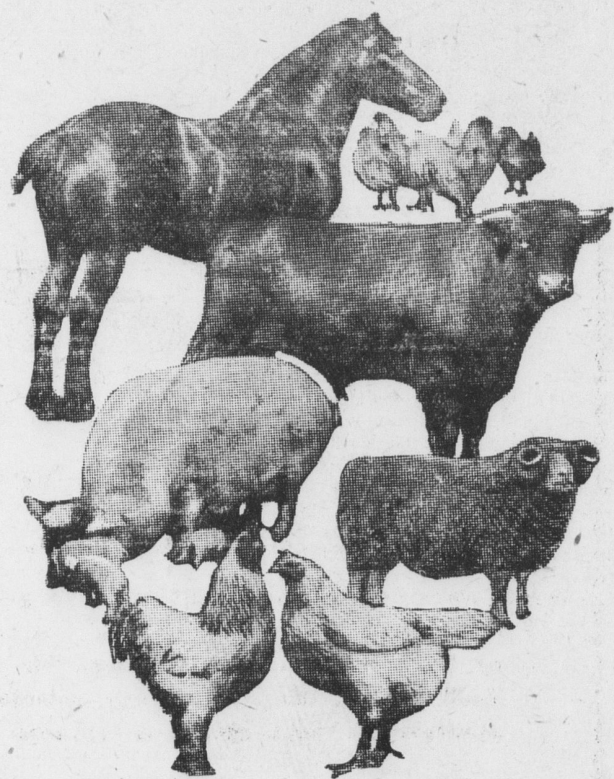

### COUNCIL ADOPTS METHOD OF

held in the Boro treasury, the remaining \$40,000.00 to be sold as of July 1st, 1931 at 4 percent interest.

Our present indebtedness is \$25,000.00 against which we have a sinking fund of \$19,780.00 which is on interest at 4 percent. This amount without any further addition to principle will create or build up an amount in excess of \$25,000.00 in seven years, so you see we will not have to set aside anything for the old issue.

However, we still have a fixed charge of \$1,000.00 interest annually on the above issue.

The interest on the new loan of \$40,000.00 at 4 per cent. interest creates another fixed charge of \$1,600.00. Another fixed charge of \$350.00 annually to create a sinking fund to retire \$10,000.00 or Series A in ten years.

This makes the total of fixed charges \$3,450.00 annually for the first ten years.

Our income from water rents is approximately \$8,000.00, which would allow a working account of \$4,550.00 annually.

Presuming that the old issue can be called as soon as the sinking fund reaches \$25,000.00, it will be out of the way before the expiration of the ten year period, that would reduce our fixed charges by \$1,000.00 annually by which the interest paid on old issue and \$400.00 interest on account of retirement of \$10,000.00 of the new issue, therefore our fixed charges for the next ten years will be as follows:

Int. on remaining \$30,000.00	\$1200.00
Sinking fund for retiring \$15,000.00	1275.00
Total amount fixed charges	\$2475.00

This amount deducted from our estimated receipts of \$8000.00 would allow a working account of \$5525.00 annually.

Now we find our bond issue has been reduced to \$15,000.00, making our fixed charges for the next ten years as follows:

Int. on remaining \$15,000	\$ 600.00
Sinking fund for retir'g issue	1275.00
Total amt. fixed charges	\$1875.00

This plan covers the thirty year period and the issue is entirely cancelled.

After careful consideration the recommendations as presented by the committee, were adopted.

A recent motion to make the rate of interest on the water bonds 4 1/2 percent was rescinded and the rate was fixed at 4 percent.

It was then decided to issue the new water bonds in the following denominations:

- Series A—Ten \$1,000 bonds.
- Series B—Fifteen \$1,000 bonds and twenty \$500 bonds.
- Series C—Fifteen \$1,000 bonds and twenty \$500 bonds.

Upon motion it was decided to make the entire issue coupon form.
