PLAYING BEAR TO HUNT WOODCHUCKS

"A hungry bear likes to dig a wood chuk from its den but it isn't a sportsmanlike proceeding for a hunter," Game Commission officials said today.

Officials referred to the practice of "hog hunters" who make no attempt to shoot the animals but depend entirely upon digging them from their holes.

Woodchucks when venturing forth in daylight usually are alert at the approach of a human being.

While the law does not protect the little animals at any season of the year, commission officials are anxious not to have them exterminated in sections where they can do no damage.

EDUCATING THE MOTORING PUBLIC

Uniformity of motor vehicle turning movement is further clarified by the amended Vehicle Code of 1931.

Ever since the Code in 1929 directed that left turns be made to the left of the center of the intersection there has existed uncertainty in the minds of motorists, due to the fact that in many towns and cities traffic pedestals continue to bear the direction, "Keep to the Right."

This is construed by drivers to mean that turns shall be made around the traffic signal, instead of to the left of it. The result has been confusion and, in numerous cases, accidents that could easily have been avoided if uniformity had been practiced.

Not only do the painted directions on pedestals continue to instruct the motorists to "Keep to the Right," but police officers in various communities continue to enforce regulations outlawed more than two years ago. The result is that local motorists, rather than wrangle with the officers, revert to the old system while strangers make the turns in accordance with the law.

When police happen to be in the vicinity, the driver obeying the law runs the risk of being halted and forced to make his left turn illegally.

After a few experiences of this kind, motorists generally follow the line of least resistance and the result is a complete upsetting of the legislative effort toward greater uniformity and added safety.

Unfortunately, the State government has not heretofore seen fit to intervene in behalf of the law-abiding motorists. Local authorities have been uncheckered in their ignoring of the Vehicle Code's provision.

Under the changes in the 1931 Code there is absolutely no excuse for local authorities to misinterpret the intent of the Legislature with respect to left turning movement to the left of the center of the intersection.

Section 1011 provides: "For the purpose of this section the center of the intersection shall mean the meeting point of the medial lines of the highways intersecting one another, except when it is occupied by a monument, grass plot or any permanent structure other than a traffic control device."

Local authorities, when the proper signs are erected, may prohibit the turning at intersections, and may, when the center of the intersection is occupied by a monument, grass plot or other permanent structure other than a traffic control device, direct traffic to keep to the right, when proper signs are erected."

Specific elimination of the traffic light pedestal as a cause for a rotary turning movement clarifies the act, and it is to be hoped that local authorities will be as quick to take cognizance of the fact as they are to enforce provisions of the Code against motorists.

The desired result so far as the motoring public is concerned, may be accomplished by removing the "Keep to the Right" signs. Absence of such signs will indicate to the driver that he will encounter no interference from police officers when in good faith, he is complying with State law.

It may be added that criticism of individual officers in this connection is not intended. The fault lies with higher authority for failure to instruct patrolmen in the duties imposed by changes in the statutes.
