

Saar Valley Mines

Under the terms of the peace treaty between Germany and the allies the mines of the Saar valley were given to France as compensation for the destruction of her northern mines during the World war and as part payment of her reparations. French oc cupation was to hold until reparations were completed. The districts containing the mines were detached from Germany and formed into the Saar territory. An international governing commission, responsible to the League of Nations, was formed for 15 years, consisting of five members-one French, one native (non-French), one British, one Czechoslovak one Finnish. In a few years a plebiscite vote is to be taken and final disposition made by decision of the League of Nations.
