ersham, chairman; Ira H. Bair, secretary; Howard J. Eshleman, B. Frank Snively and John K. Herr.

With the merger approved members of this committee became the voting trustees for the stockholders of the eleven leased lines and the Conestoga Traction Company. The members met last night and announced they were prepared to take over the operation of the transit facilities of the city and county as soon as the proper authorization arrives from Harrisburg.

The next step of the committee, one of the members declared, will be to apply to the Public Service Commission for permission to stop using trolleys and to replace them with buses.

These petitions will be presented individually for each of the county lines upon which the use of buses is being contemplated in order that any opposition which might develop in some instances can be met without interfering with changes in other instances.

The new company formed of the merger of the Conestoga Traction Company and the leased lines is known as the Conestoga Transportation Company.
