SENTENCED TO 5 TO 10 YEARS, OUT AFTER 1 1/2 YEARS

Ralph J. Boyd, former city controller, at Lancaster stepped out of the Eastern Penitentiary Thursday afternoon shortly after one o'clock a free man after serving only one year and six months of a sentence of from five to ten years for the speculation of city funds.

Boyd's parole, which became effective Christmas Eve was handed down several days ago by the State Board of Pardons. At a hearing upon his application for a parole November 17, the petition was unopposed. In a letter to the board, Judge Charles I. Landis declared, however, that he felt the sentence imposed had not been excessive.

Following his release from the Eastern Penitentiary in Philadelphia, Boyd left immediately for Elizabethtown, where he planned to spend Christmas day with his children. Boyd was sentenced April 21, 1930, when he pleaded guilty before Judge Landis to charges of embezzling \$11,700. In addition to the sentence given him, he was fined \$1,100.

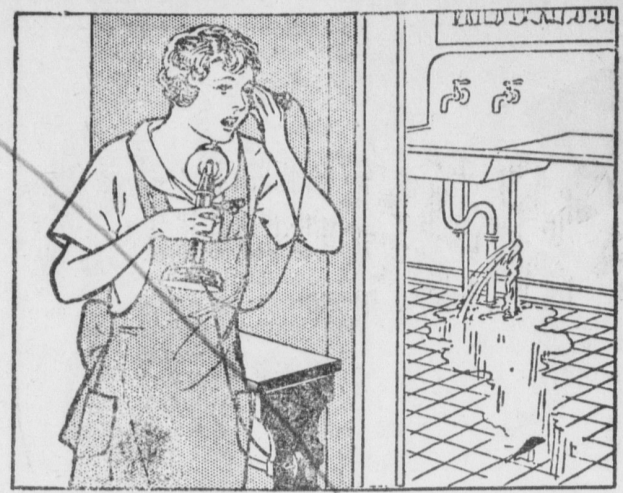
