Pennsylvania Farm Show Jan. 18--22

The sixteenth annual Pennsylvania Farm Show will be held at Harrisburg January 18-22. There will be four acres of commercial displays, three acres of competitive exhibits and six meeting halls all under one roof. There will be \$37,000 in cash prizes and there is no charge for admission.

The show will be held under direction of State Farm Products Show Commission with cooperation of Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Pennsylvania State College Department of Public Instruction, State Council of Agricultural Associations, State Horticultural Association, Vegetable Growers' Association, Nursermen's Association, Potato Growers' Association, Tobacco Growers' Association, Sheep Breeders' and Wool Growers' Association, State Beekeepers' Association, Livestock Breeders' Association, Dairymen's Association, Federation of Holstein-Friesian Clubs, Holstein-Friesian Registry Association, Ayrshire Breeders' Association, Jersey Cattle Club, Guernsey Breeders' Association, Hereford Breeders' Association, Brown Swiss Breeders' Association, Berkshire Breeders' Association, Chester White Breeders' Association, Durco-Jersey Breeders' Association, Hampshire Swine Breeders' Association, Poland China Breeders' Association, State Poultry Association, Pigeon Show Association, Pittsburg District Dairy Council, Interstate Dairy Council, Dairymen's Cooperative Sales Company, Interstate Milk Producers' Association, Dairymen's League, Threshermen's and Farmers' Association, State Grange, Society of Farm Women, Farm Bureau Federation, State Chamber of Commerce, Harrisburg Chamber of Commerce, State Veterinary-Medical Association, Association of Dairy and Milk Inspectors, and Pennsylvania Joint Committee on Rural Electrification.

Spoons Made of Shell

Probably First in Use Way back somewhere in the Paleolithic age implements resembling the spoon were first designed. Antiquarians tell us the first ladle shaped implements were of shell, used probably to test the temperature of hot liquids. Spoons with handles cut from the horns of animals were followed, in turn, by wood spoons from which the article derives its name. The old English word "spoon" means a splinter of wood.

Spoons of gold and silver are mentioned in the Old Testament and we know that early Christians used silver spoons in the baptismal service. Today the archbishop of Canterbury anoints the sovereign at coronation with an English spoon 700 years old. During the Tudor period the apostle spoon, for many years prized by collectors, came into use. The bowl was pear shaped, the handle six squared or hexagonal and on the end was the figure of an apostle. A complete set of these spoons consisted of one of each of the twelve apostles and the "Master" spoon with the figure of Christ. Spoons continued in this pear shaped form with various shaped ends such as the diamond, acorn, or seal, until the time of Charles I.

REPORT SHOWS 43,045 VETERANS ARE IN HOSPITALS

Washington, D. C.—A total of 43,045 veterans are now under government hospital treatment, according to a report from the Veterans' Administration. The compilation was under date of November 30th and showed the following classification: Tuberculosis, 7,574; nervous and mental, 18,875; and general medical and surgical, 16,596.

The veterans are under treatment in 327 hospitals, of which 219 were private institutions caring for patients under contract with the Veterans' Administration. There were 2,328 patients in the private hospitals.

World war veterans on November 30th had made 3,563,929 loans on their Adjusted Service certificates, totaling \$1,186,815,810, according to a report from the Veterans' Administration. During the month of November 32,743 loans were made in the total amount of \$12,362,307.

Ancient Eye Doctor

A stamp belonging to a Roman eye doctor who practiced in London about 300 A. D. was discovered during the course of excavation work near London bridge. It was made of a flat stone two inches square and three-eighths of an inch thick. On the four narrow sides had been carved the name of the doctor, Caius Silius Tetricus, and his prescriptions for four eye troubles. The stamp was apparently used to impress the doctor's name on his form of solid sticks, resembling sticks of sealing wax.
