Spoons Made of Shell

Probably First in Use olithic age implements resembling the spoon were first designed. Antiqua-riars tell us the first ladle shaped Eby and Mr. and Mrs. N. N. Baer. implements were of shell, used probably to test the temperature of hot liquids. Spoons with handles cut from the horns of animals were followed, -in turn, by wood spoons from which the article derives its name.

Spoons of gold and silver are mentioned in the Old Testament and we week know that early Christians used silver spoons in the baptismal service. Tothe archbishop of Canterbury anoints the sovereign at coronation with an English spoon 700 years old. During the Tudor period the apostle M. Ironville at 7:30 P. M. spoon, for many years prized by col- Mrs. Luther Ulrich and Mrs. Paul lectors, came into use. The howl was pear shaped, the handle six squared or hexagonal and on the end was the figure of an apostle. A complete set of these spoons consisted of one of each of the twelve apostles and the "Master" spoon with the figure of Christ. Spoons continued in this pear shaped form with various shaped ends such as the diamond, acorn, or seal. until the time of Charles I.
