BLAMES NEED FOR SLEEP IN CRASHES

The accident hazard that goes along with too many hours of con-tinuous driving without sleep was cited today by Walter W. Matthews chief of the safety division of the Bureau of the Highway Patrol and Safety. Within the past month the division has had before it case of two truck drivers who had been in volved in fatal accidents. Both admitted they had been driving continuously for from 24 to 36 hours

without sleep. "While neither man admitted that he was asleep when the accident occurred, the evidence in each case tended to indicate that he was asleep," Matthews said. "No man is fit to drive an automobile or a truck that number of hours without sleep. Truck owners who demand such long hours of driving have no regard for the safety of their drivers or that of other motorists.
