135 VOTES FOR PASSAGE 62 AGAINST DRY REPEAL

The Conner-Sowers dry repeal triumphed decisively in the House at Harrisburg and Pennsylvania thus moved to rub out State prohibition for the first time since the Snyder-Armstrong Enforcement Act was written into the statute books nearly ten years ago.

The vote was 135 for passage to 62 against.

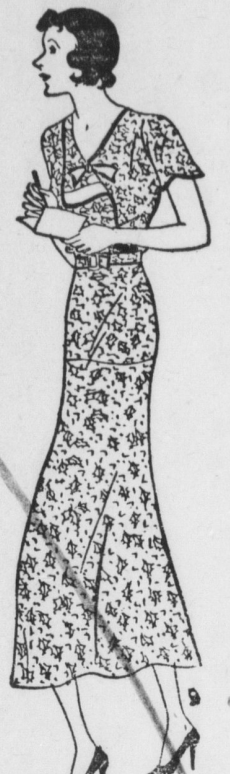
