"Maternal mortality in the United States represents a most unenviable figure. In spite of the efficiency of the medical profession, the fine hospitals and the advanced knowledge of antiseptic control, nearly 16,000 women lost their lives from child-birth or associated conditions in this country last year. Unfortunately this sorry situation is to a great extent beyond the definite control of the attending physician and public health officials, stated Dr. Theodore B. Appel, Secretary of Health.

"This March poster is one of thousands now being put up in the school rooms throughout the country as a part of the campaign of the American Automobile Association and its affiliated clubs to further reduce the toll of deaths resulting from accidents on the streets and ghways. The fact that of motor fatalities involving both adults and children decreased approximately fifteen percent during 1932, as compared with 1931, has greatly encouraged those interested in the safety movement."

Every school in Lancaster city and most of those throughout the county, including a number of oneroom rural schools, receive these monthly posters from the Automobile Club. Mr. Gable says that the schools not receiving them can make arrangements to do so by getting in touch with the Club at 10 and 12 South Prince street, Lanschools for this service.
