This was something for a trade expert to answer so I went to Mr. Felix Coste, who has recently taken an active part in negotiations on coffee with the Brazilian government.

"Good satisfying coffee, day by day, isn't an accident. It's just intelligence and efficiency in coffee making."

"If your own coffee isn't uniformly good, don't jump to the conclusion that the quality of the coffee you bought is at fault. There is comparatively little in the quality of coffee on the American market today.
