GOV. CROP PRODUCTION LOANS TO BE AVAILABLE

All applicants for government crop production loans from Lancaster County are hereby requested to meet the local loan committee at Room 202 Post Office Building, Lancaster on Saturday, April 1 from 9 A. M. until 2 P. M.

Under the regulations covering these loans, all monies so secured must be used for crop production and include costs of seeds, fertilizers, sprays, duds and feeds.

A first lien on all crops growing or to be grown shall be required as security for such loans.

The chief difference required as security for such loans is that the borrower agrees to plant only 70 percent of his 1932 acreage of cash crops.

This ruling does not apply in the case of orchards or in the case of the smaller farmers who grow the minimum number of acres stipulated for the various crops.
