GAME COMMISSION **BUYS 5865 ACRES**

Title recently was taken to 5865 acres of game territory in Lycom-ing, Cambria and Bedford counties, the Game Commission announced today. The 5253 acre tract in Ly-coming county will be a part of the State Game Lands No. 75. This tract now comprises 10,419 acres on the headwaters of English, Buckey and Otter Runs. Deer, bear, grouse, rabbits, and other game is abundant The streams furnish excellent fish-

The Cambria county tract consisting of 450 acres will form a part of State Game Lands No. 79 in the Blacklick township of that county. This will bring the total area of State Game Lands No. 79 to 1416 acres.


