Title, Man on Horseback,

Given Napoleon, Boulanger applied to Gen. George Ernest Boulanger, a French soldier and politician who lived from 1837 to 1891. A veteran of the Franco-German and other wars, he sought popularity by appearminister of war. At first a demagogue and "jingo" who played to the radicalparliament and favoring militarism, a weakened parliamentary system and a stronger executive. His opponents called his proposals dictatorship and Caesarism. His method of attacking the parliamentary system was to put and committed suicide in Brussels.

The term is commonly applied to dictators who court the favor of the mob in order to rule them. Napoleon has been called the "Man on Horseback" or "Robespierre on Horseback," in the sense of a ruthless leader to trample the people in order to furth-
