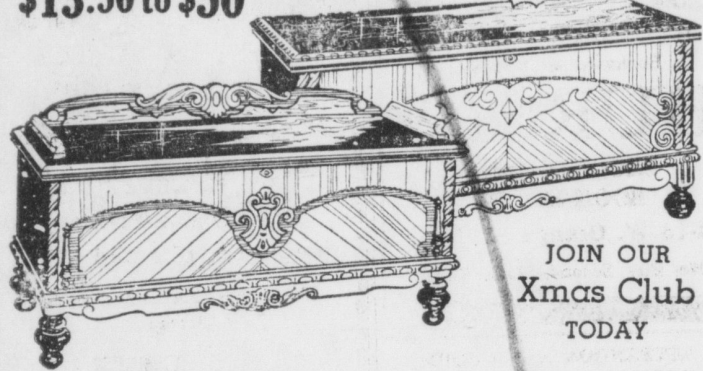

SUGGESTIONS ON THE HOME DECORATION Today the Home Beautification Display Committee of the Lancaster City and County Electrical Contractors and Dealers, released suggestions on outdoor decorations, and the lighting during the Christmas Season. The Christmas lighting contest starts on December 18 and ends December 30.

Following are suggestions for those contemplating decorating the outside of their homes:

Substitute a red lamp for the customary one in the entrance fixture and place a wreath around it. Place electric candles in Christmas wreaths in the windows.

Employ colored lights on trees, either living trees in the ground or cut ones in supporters. Illuminate the shrubbery on the lawn.

Run strings of colored lights along the veranda. Festoon strings of colored lights along the eaves of the house. Place colored lights in flower boxes.

Place illuminated stars on doors or on the roof. Entwine colored lights in wreaths or garlands and hang them in the windows or about the outside of the house.
