Antiques Highly Prized by Old-Time Egyptians

Modern antique hunters have nothing on the ancients, some of whom treasured their own antiques which were more than 1,000 years old before the Christian era.

The bit of alabaster cup or goblet was found in the level of Selucia inhabited from about 140 B. C. to 43 A. D. On the fragment are inscribed in Egyptian hieroglyphics, the words: "The Majesty of the King of Upper and Lower Egypt, the Lord of the Two Lands."

Undoubtedly the goblet was part of gifts sent from the unknown pharaoh to his fellow ruler in Selucia and even centuries later the fragments were treasured by the Selucian householders, who believed them to be potent charms.

Breed for Disease Resistance

Breeding for disease resistance may prove exceedingly helpful in solving the problem of excessive laying flock mortality. Three years ago 14 daughters of a White Leghorn at State College were housed. At the end of the laying year 13 of these survived and they had averaged 220 eggs per bird. Last year eight of the hens were used in the breeding pens. Of their progeny 84 pullets were housed. At the end of six months of production 81 of these pullets were still alive.

Onion Is Popular

Sweet Spanish onion is a new variety which is becoming very popular. Since it requires a long growing season the seed should be sown in shallow boxes or flats early in March at the rate of 6 to 8 seeds to the inch of row in rows two inches apart. A box one foot square will grow 500 to 600 plants.
