Stick a potato chip in one end to look like a sail, or garnish with a sprig of

Mountain Peaks: Make piles of fluffy mashed potatoes as high jagged as possible to repr sent snow on mountain peaks. Around the bottom, pile hot buttered spinach forming the trees below the snow line. Serve with

Spinach on the Half Shell: An-Spinach on the Half Shell: Another attractive way to make spinach acceptable to the nursery is to cut the tops off baked potatoes, scoop them out, and refil them with the potatoes mixed with butter, a little cream and spinach seasoned to taste. Cover the tops with grated cheese, and brown in a hot oven.*
