#### FIGURES TELL THE STORY AS V-8 SWEEPS COUNTRY

126 per cent Jump Over 1933. Leads Competitor by 28,871 cars. With an increased lead of 2211 units, the Ford V-8 for 1934 is now 28,871 cars ahead of its next competitor. With complete June returns in from 32 states, deliveries stand at 268,373.

While the impetus gained by business in all lines has found reflection in automobile sales, an interesting feature is this: Ford's deliveries are 126% ahead of 1933, while the runner-up can only show 15% more cars sold for the corresponding period. The increased demand for the V-8 has been seven times as great as that for contender for first honor!

April was a record-breaking month with its registration total of 229,000 but the June sales as stated above have exceeded that figure, showing that the sale of passenger cars is continuing strong throughout the United States. The June passenger car figures show an increase of 28.37 per cent over the complete registration total of June a year ago, when 174,219 automobiles were sold, and an increase of 2.04 per cent over 219,163, the total for May, 1934. At the end of June, in the entire country, 995,121 passenger cars had been sold, while last year at this time the total sales for the same period amounted to 682,481.

While the country as a whole lagged behind May in truck sales, June, 1934, shows an increase of only about 26% 49.56 per cent. Ford's truck gain. However, is better than 100% over June 1933. The nearest competitor shows an increase of only about 26% for the same period.

Daily returns for Wayne County, Michigan show the V-8 maintaining its sensational dominance in the home of "all three" outselling the car No. 2 by three to one, car No. 3, five to one, Detroit-Wayne County Registrations

for July are as follows: Ford 278; Car No. 2, was 930 and Car No. 3 was 725. Coast to coast, and Lakes to Gulf, individual buyers, fleet owners, municipalities are preferring the V-8 against the field, in numbers that demonstrate what its makers claim—"The greatest car value for the money in the world."

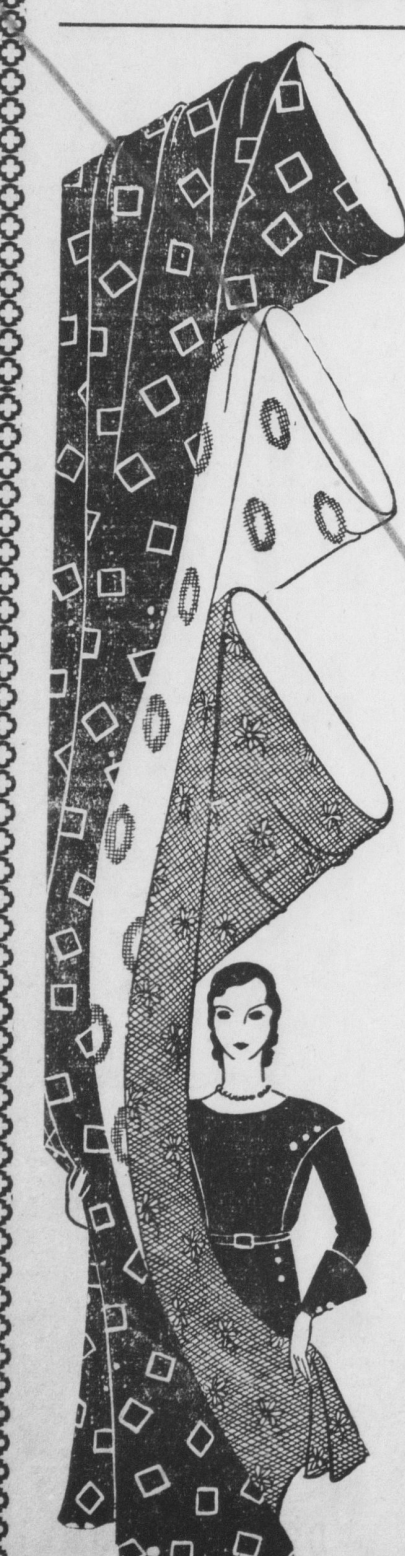
