DLAY-BOYS and party-girls are these familiar peas which you have probably been accustomed to think of as home-bodies. True they are at home on every-day dinner table, but are equally dashing and de in party guise. Serve them in some of these attractive

Christmas Candle Christmas Candle So Cut tops from six very small rimatoes, or six canned Love Apples, remove centers, drain well and dust insides with salt. Mix one-half cup finely chopped celery with one-fourth cup mayonnaise and mix one-half cup canned peas with one-fourth cup mayonnaise. Choose firm, sturdy asparagus tips from a 1942-ounce can, and stand one upright in each tomato candlestick, packing around first with dlestick, packing around first with celery, then with peas to make it steady. Have the green peas on top to show. Put a small piece of pimiento on the tip of each stalk to resemble the flame. Place in the center of watercress wreaths on salad plates and serve with tiny lemon sandwiches. This serves six persons.

Peas with a Partner

Cauliflower and Peas en Casserole: Separate one head of cauliflower into flowerlets and boil until tender. Drain and lay in a buttered casserole, keeping the pieces as unbroken as possible. Make a white sauce of three tablespoons butter, three tablespoons flour, one and threefourths cups milk, one-half tea-spoon salt and a few grains of pepper. Simmer one cup of canned peas for three or four minutes, and pass through a sieve. Add to the white sauce. Pour over the cauliflower and cover with buttered crumbs. Brown in a hot oven. This serves eight nersons.
